Greetings school leaders,

As this school year races to the finish line I'm excited to share some important updates...

Firstly, your votes are in, and it looks like the best date for hosting this year's summer

convening is **Wednesday August 9, 2023,** so please mark your calendars! It will take place at the Minnesota Humanities Center again from 9:30am to 1pm. We're asking that school leaders and board chairs attend at a minimum, as our goal is to present the Guild's Approved Authorizing Plan (AAP) guidelines for the next five years. Watch your email for more information in the coming months.

Secondly, and in response to your feedback, we have made the decision to cease using Epicenter for records management at the close of FY2023. This will both offer the Guild savings which can be utilized for greater school support, and allow added efficiencies by bringing school records to a secure online server we administer directly, and which utilizes applications most are familiar with already (Google Documents and Google Classroom). This new process was designed and pressure tested by no other than the Guild's own Tech Guru Buddy Ferrari. Which means you can expect more of the same in terms of wonderful Technical Assistance (with a smile). So please let your current Epicenter administrator know (if it's not you) they can expect to hear from Buddy in July to set up and support the transition. In the meantime please continue to upload to Epicenter all required records for the remainder of FY23.

Thirdly, the end of the school year also means it's a season of reflection. As I mentioned last month we are looking for your help to let us know how we're doing, and how we can better serve you in the future. Please be on the lookout for the Guild survey in your mailbox shortly. If you have any questions or want to share it with additional board members or staff, please don't hesitate to reach out to the Guild's Administrative Force Debbie Weckman for assistance.

Finally, please note the following Annual Reporting Updates/Timeline:

- ASAP: The MN Guild will be sending FY22 report feedback to every portfolio school along with an updated guidance document.
- by June 30: School feedback and questions on annual reporting to the Guild
- by July 31: Final guidance on FY23 Annual Report
- August 9: Summer Convening / Technical Assistance; 9:30am to 1pm



Apply now for the Stronger Connections Grant ~ deadline June 9, 2023

The Minnesota Department of Education's Equity Diversity and Inclusion (EDI) Center invites applications to the Bipartisan Safer Communities Act (BSCA) Stronger Connections Grant. This competitive program is focused on reducing the risk of gun violence in our schools and communities. Local educational agencies (LEAs) are eligible to receive grants from \$200,000 up to \$500,000 for planning, training, and implementing a wide range of programs and practices that promote a safe and healthy learning environment.

MN teacher standards get a 21st century update

The <u>"Standards of Effective Practice"</u> are the knowledge and skills a teacher needs to demonstrate before they enter the classroom.

- The new standards **sharpen focus on equity** and culturally-sustaining teaching practices —pushing teachers to check their own biases.
- They emphasize belief in students—adapting to meet each learner's unique assets and needs—and include students, families, and communities in learning design.

Why it matters

Students thrive when teachers are able to see them for who they are, what they're capable of.

EE gave continuous input to **make the standards more student-centered**—and our influence is evident in the final record.

What's next

Teacher prep providers have until July 2025 to implement the new standards.



Q: If our board is meeting in person, can some board members join the meeting and participate virtually? A: Open Meeting Law does allow for board members to participate by videoconference technology (including Zoom) under the following guidelines:

Managing Open Meeting Law Post Pandemic

- A meeting must take place in a space that is publicly accessible.
- All board members, whatever their physical location must be able to see and hear each other and see and hear all discussion and testimony presented at any location where at least one member is present.

- Members of the public present at the regular meeting location must be able to see and hear all testimony and all votes of members of the board.
- At least one member of the body is present at the regular meeting location.
- All votes are conducted by roll call.
- The public body must give notice of the regular meeting location, of the fact that some members may participate by telephone or other electronic means, and of the right of the public to monitor the meeting from another location.
- Each location at which a member of the board is present is open and accessible to the public.
- This requirement that the remote location is open and accessible to the public need not be met IF the board member has not participated more than three times in a calendar year from a location that is not open and accessible to the public.
