

The MN Guild is proud and excited to spotlight Exploration High School this month.

On March 18, MPR News gathered teachers and students already participating in ethnic studies and asked them to share their experiences, with the goal of imagining the future as ethnic studies is incorporated into schools across the state.

Ethnic studies will roll out to Minnesota K-12 classrooms in 2026. The content area was <u>added to the state social studies standards this winter</u>, joining history, geography, economics and government as major themes.

The Minnesota Department of Education is <u>still working on a final framework</u> to guide curriculum. But some districts aren't waiting.

In 2022, both <u>St. Paul</u> and <u>Minneapolis</u> public schools added ethnic studies as a high school class required for graduation. Other districts have had ethnic studies style classes in place for even longer.



Enrollment Estimator Tools

The largest share of the education finance appropriation, general education aid and other categorical aids, depend on Average Daily Membership (ADM) to calculate many funding formulas. MDE uses estimated ADM from the Average Daily Membership Web Estimates (ADMWE) system for these calculations until actual ADM calculations are available. Once actual ADM data is available from Minnesota Automated Reporting Student System (MARSS), the aid calculations will move away from ADM estimates (ADMWE) to actual student ADM data as reported in MARSS.

Therefore, it is extremely important that the most precise estimates are correct in the ADMWE System for the upcoming school years. Please review

and update the district or charter school's three-year estimates for both ADM and English Learners (EL) as MDE will use those for forecasting purposes.

The Charter Enrollment Estimator and District Enrollment Estimator tools have been updated for estimating FY25 enrollment. They can be found on the Average Daily Membership webpage using the following the path or link: Districts">MDE>Districts, Schools and Educators>, School Finance>MARSS Student Accounting>Average Daily Membership.

School Nutrition Program

Food Safety Inspection Report Guidance for School Year 2023–24

USDA released a memo with guidance on food safety inspection report requirements for School Year (SY) 2023–24. The Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2024, requires state agencies to report the number of annual food safety inspections in schools to the Food and Nutrition Service (FNS). For more information, review the State Agency Food Safety Inspections Report for SY 2023–2024.

<u>School Food Authorities (SFAs) Must Report Health Inspection Dates</u>

Nutrition Program Services is required by the USDA to collect data on health inspections for every school site that participates in the National School Lunch Program and School Breakfast Program.

- Every sponsor participating in these programs will receive an email with a link to the report that must be completed for SY 2023–24 by June 30, 2024.
- The email will be sent to the SFA contact listed in the sponsor application.
- The sponsor will need to report the date each health inspection occurred between July 1, 2023 and June 30, 2024 for each approved site in The Cyber-Linked Interactive Child Nutrition System (CLiCS).

SENATE EDUCATION FINANCE COMMITTEE ACTION:

The Senate Education Finance Committee also unveiled their Omnibus bill, followed by public testimony and amendments. Much like the House Education Finance bill, the bulk of the spending was for implementing the Read Act and expanding the Voluntary Pre-Kindergarten program.

The bill includes the following highlights:

- \$3 million to extend Safety Aid to charter schools in onetime aid of \$44 per pupil **Included due to the MACS Safe Schools Bill and member school testimony & advocacy**
- \$34 million for the Read Act (\$25 million for teacher and substitute compensation for training)
- Working group on teacher and paraprofessional compensation
- Attendance improvement pilot (9 school districts) and chronic absenteeism working group
- Requires statewide health standards by 2026
- Special education apprenticeship programs in intermediates
