

Welcome to Minnesota Charter Board Training and Development! Board members are responsible for understanding key statutes in three areas:

- Board roles and responsibilities
- Financial management
- · Employment policies and practices

#### **Reminder:**

Per MN Statutes §124E.07, subd. 7:

- New board members must begin training within 6 months of being seated
- Training must be completed within 12 months
- Failure to comply results in automatic ineligibility to serve

Charter Schools Program Update: Applications Double; Senate Supports Up to \$500M Investment

Last month, the U.S. Department of Education announced that applications to the Charter Schools Program have doubled compared to the last cycle, showing strong demand for high-quality public school options. Additionally, the Senate Appropriations Committee advanced a bill providing up to \$500 million for the program—along with key flexibilities to improve access to

high-quality public charter schools nationwide.

# **US National Charter School Spotlight**

With nearly 4 million students enrolled in public charter schools nationwide, demand is at an all-time high. A recent Forbes article by Jeanne Allen and Katie Nelligan of the Center for Education Reform explores why families are increasingly choosing charters—and how policy is helping meet that demand.

# Charters as Engines of Innovation

Charter schools are described as "engines of talent development, economic mobility, and innovation," especially in communities where skilled workers are needed most. From aerospace to healthcare, charters are preparing students for the jobs our economy demands.

#### Federal and state leaders are stepping up to support charter growth:

- Equitable Access to School Facilities Act: Would improve access to facilities funding charters' biggest barrier to expansion
- Senate Hearings: Charter leaders shared how public schools are driving student and community success
- State Highlights:
  - Indiana: Districts must share property tax revenue with charters
  - North Dakota: Became the 47th state to authorize charters
  - Georgia: Incentivizing districts to approve high-quality charters to reduce waitlists



# **<u>m State Legislative Updates: Charter-Specific Provisions</u>**

New legislation is reshaping charter school governance, transparency, and operations. Here are key highlights to keep your board informed and compliant:

# Authorizer Requirements

#### Authorizers must now:

- Include MAPES reviews in annual reports
- Attend MDE-approved trainings annually
- · Post key accountability and financial data on their websites
- · Livestream non-renewal and termination hearings

# Charter Transparency & Accountability

#### **Charter schools must:**

- Link accountability info on their websites and share it with families upon request
- Include all proposed grades/sites in supply and demand studies

### Charter Board Changes

# **Boards must now:**

- Include a Finance Committee
- Host monthly meetings with authorizers if under financial corrective action
- · Ensure board members take an oath of office
- Comply with new conflict of interest rules for Affiliated Building Company boards
- · Follow a ban on dual board membership and accepting gifts

# Procurement Process Updates

- For contracts between \$25K-\$175K: use sealed bids or direct negotiations
- For contracts over \$175K: sealed bids are required (MACS will release a New Law Primer if passed)

# Other Key Education Policy Provisions

# Attendance Policy Changes

- Principals now track excused/unexcused absences
- Must report unenrolled students within 15 days of school start
- · Students are considered present if receiving services

#### READ Act Updates

- Evidence-based intervention requirement delayed to 2026–27
- · Clarifies provisions for dual immersion programs
- · Expands approved training providers

# Substitution Pilot Program

- · Makes permanent the short-call substitute license for support staff
- Adjusts pay and assignment duration rules

#### School Lunch Reimbursement

- State funding reduced from 12.5¢ to 6.25¢ per meal (starting 2028)
- · Students may purchase a second reimbursable meal

#### Health & Safety

- · Schools must have cardiac response plans
- Students may administer opioid antagonists to peers
- · Updates to language access plans for special education




